

ABOUT ST MARK'S

FEES

Cost: \$2,500 (or \$250 per unit)

Students will be required to pay for each unit that they are enrolled in at the start of each term. If you are completing the entire course, a 5% discount will apply if you pay for the full course prior to commencement.

Course progression and graduation is conditional upon timely payment of fees. St Mark's reserves the right to withdraw students who are in arrears.

ADMISSION

You will need to provide a letter from your church minister indicating that they:

- consider you have the capacity for introductory training in theology and lay ministry; and
- take responsibility for you to be inducted into safe church practices relevant to their church setting.

If English is not your first language, you may need to complete a language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) indicator test prior to enrolment. You must be an Australian or New Zealand citizen, an Australian permanent resident, or hold a permanent humanitarian visa.



The course gives you foundational and inspiring training by balancing practical skills with Biblical grounding. Our introduction to theology is engaging and applicable to your life. You will also gain skills in starting a new ministry, pastoral care, leading volunteers, running small groups, and communicating your faith in Jesus.

The Diploma's online and intensive format makes it perfect for regional and remote learners, and is particularly aimed at younger and older people who are new to, or reengaging with, study.

As we are a Registered Training Organisation (RTO), this Diploma is a nationally recognised qualification.

READING THE BIBLE

(CMTTHE502) Utilise the analysis of theological data

You will be given an introduction to reading and interpreting English texts from the Bible, as well as an appreciation of the Bible's story line, basic exegesis, and an awareness of research tools to help you read the Bible.

CHRISTIAN BELIEFS

(CMTTHE501) Analyse and interpret Christian Scripture and Theology

You will be introduced to reading and interpreting English texts from the Bible; Biblical Theological theory and other ways of interpreting the Bible; basic exegesis; and an awareness of research tools to help you read the Bible.

COMMUNICATING IN A CHURCH COMMUNITY

(BSBCMM401) Make a presentation

This unit provides practical training in preparing for and leading a service in a range of contexts. You will be encouraged in reflective practice that both builds up the Christian community and aids visitors in encountering Jesus Christ.

BEGINNING NEW TEAM MINISTRY

(CHCCDE002) Develop and implement community programs

You will learn how to research ministry needs and opportunities, and plan for and begin new team ministry. We will also cover the logistics of one-off event ministry and ongoing ministry programs, and impart our experience and knowledge on how to lead volunteers and evaluate the effectiveness of the ministry.

THEOLOGICAL WISDOM

(CMTTHE504) Analyse and apply new theological insights

This unit aims to enable you to grow in your own Christian life and your self-awareness, so you can develop discernment and wisdom when facing new theological ideas. *This subject is delivered during a weekend intensive in Canberra.

BEYOND SUNDAY

(CMTMIN501) Facilitate personal or social change through the application of theological ideas

In this unit, you will learn how to apply theological ideas and the Bible to your Christian life. The unit focuses on two main things: a framework for thinking about a topic as it relates to living as a Christian, and how to write and lead Bible study groups.

RESEARCHING CHRISTIAN BELIEFS

(CMTTHE503) Research and analyse information within a theological theme or issue

You will be given a framework for thinking about Doctrine, as well as the opportunity to delve into a particular area of Christian beliefs.

WELCOME

(CHCCOM001) Provide first point of contact

You will learn how to welcome and integrate visitors into your church community, focusing on both process and interpersonal aspects of welcoming.

PASTORAL CARE

(CHCPAS001) Plan for the provision of pastoral and spiritual care

This unit offers introductory pastoral care skills. You will be encouraged to recognise and avoid over-functioning, to intentionally include others in pastoral care where appropriate, and to integrate your faith into your practice.

COMMUNICATING THE MESSAGE OF JESUS CHRIST

(CMTMIN502) Present theological beliefs and their implications

You will learn to communicate the message of Jesus Christ to others in a variety of contexts. This unit covers evangelism, sharing our story, apologetics, and preparing a Bible talk for a context of your choice. *This subject is delivered during a weekend intensive in Canberra.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Students can enrol in any term, although the course is designed to commence in Term 1. Application closing dates can be found on our website – stmarks.edu.au
